and secured deployment and use of IT resources. He said, NCS intends to make this stakeholders, meeting a pungent platform for analyzing the situation critically and provide the reliable solutions to Nation's Cyber Security Challenges. Thus, NCS plans to invite experts from various aspects of the economy to lead discussions at the meeting. NCS remains committed towards addressing the factors mitigating efficient use of IT for leapfrogging development, he added.

Expected to attend the event are representatives of financial institutions, regulatory agencies, government institutions, telecommunication companies, corporate organizations, IT professionals, security experts and law enforcement agencies.

The potentials and trends of cyber attacks have also taken another dimension since the current pandemic (Covid-19) has forced many individuals, governments and corporate organizations to move most of their operations and activities online. We have also seen recently many reported attacks on public facing systems in Nigeria. Consequently, concerted effort is needed to enhance Cyber Security in Nigeria.

# UPDATE FROM MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATION AND DIGITAL ECONOMY

## PANTAMI APPROVES RELEASE OF IMPROVED NIN SLIP, NIMC MOBILE APP

**T**he Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Dr Isa Ali Ibrahim Pantami, has approved the development and release of an improved National Identity Number (NIN) slip and a Mobile App.

The Minister said that the move is part of the Federal Government's Policy to improve the process of obtaining NIN and linking it to SIM, which was sent to the National Identity Management Commission (NIMC) and the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC) for implementation.

The N20 and N40 fees for NIN verification by individuals and Mobile Network Operators, respectively, were also waived.

"These efforts are aimed at supporting the Policy to link subscribers' NIN to their SIM, which was approved by the Federal Government earlier in the year and communicated to the NCC on the 4th of February, 2020, the Minister said in a statement signed by his Technical Assistant (Information Technology), Dr Femi Adeluyi.

Pantami said that the highly anticipated Web Service (MWS) Application, called the NIMC Mobile App, and the improved National Identification Number (NIN) Slip are now available for public use.

The App provides a secure channel for all Nigerians and legal residents to easily verify and authenticate their identities on-the-go using smartphones. It also enables them to link the NIN to their phone numbers.

"The development of the App and other tools to support the National Identity Number (NIN) process align with the National Digital Economy Policy for a Digital Nigeria.

"The App offers a built-in harmonization process that allows for its use across other government services including the NCC, Federal Inland Revenue Service, Federal Road Safety Commission and National Health Insurance Scheme, to mention a few.

On the other hand, the new improved NIN slip is a pocket friendly and an easy to verify version of the NIN. It can be accessed via a self-service Portal, where people who already have been issued the NIN, can log in, download a PDF of the document in color (if preferred), print and laminate as desired. The current NIN Slip will remain valid and will be gradually phased-out.

"The App is available on the Google Play store for Android users and App Store for IOS users. Details on how to download and install the App and download the improved NIN slip are available on the websites and social media platforms of the Ministry and NIMC. Users can also download the improved NIN Slip at <https://dashboard.nimc.gov.ng>.

"The Honourable Minister has directed NIMC to respond to enquiries and also provide multimedia guides to make it easy for users to obtain their improved NIN slips and install the App.

# SMART AGRIC WILL PROMOTE DIGITAL INNOVATION, ENTREPRENEURSHIP - PANTAMI

The Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Dr. Isa Pantami, has said that smart agriculture is part of promoting digital innovation and entrepreneurship in Nigeria. The minister made the statement on Saturday, at the closing ceremony to end the adoption of farmers for the National Adopted Village for Smart Agriculture, NAVSA, empowerment programme for 140 farmers in Ekiti State.

This, the government noted, was to improve food productivity, increase wealth and income of farmers, agric value chain players, improve food security, promote access to international food markets and host of other agricultural products.

According to the minister, this initiative was sequel to the need to build a robust environment to drive a digital platform for transformation of the Agricultural sector for a Digital Nigeria. To this end, the National Information Technology Development Agency, NITDA, under the supervision of the Federal Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy and in collaboration with Ekiti State Government partnered for the project.

According to Mr Pantami, the requirements to succeed in the 4th industrial revolution necessitate digitization to be at the core of any nation's developmental policy and strategy.

He said: "The digital economy is the single most important driver of innovation, competitiveness and growth and there is no doubt that digitization of the economy is one of the most critical issues of our time.



"Traditional industries are being reshaped by business models that have never existed before."

He said digitization has a proven impact on economy and society by reducing unemployment, improving quality of life, and boosting access to knowledge. He added that digitization is transforming the world in almost every aspect of life during the last few decades.

"The access to the internet, increase of people using mobile phones, social media and other digital services changed the way people interact, communicate, learn and work in almost every country.

"This made his Excellency, President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR to unveil and launch the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy (NDEPS) for a Digital Nigeria on the 28th of November, 2019 with a vision to transform Nigeria into a leading digital economy providing quality life and digital economies for all.

"This administration is building and leading the journey of digitizing every sector of the economy," he revealed.

Mr Pantami asserted that the potential

benefits of digitizing the agro-food sector are convincing, but would require major transformations of farming systems, rural economies, communities and natural resource management.

“This is a challenge which requires a systematic, technology-driven and holistic approach to achieving the full potential and benefits. “This Smart Agriculture is part of promoting Digital Innovation and Digital Entrepreneurship.

“Agriculture has been very significant to our economy as a nation and it continues to remain very relevant in our country,” he said.

He, however, said the ministry had discovered that the output Nigeria generates from agriculture compared to efforts put and resources being spent has no justification for that. He, therefore, said in order to enhance the output from agriculture to save cost and at the same time to integrate it, they came up with Smart Agric.

Mr Pantami emphasised that building a digital platform to connect agriculture ecosystem to deliver services to farmers in a more productive and efficient manner is in the interest of nurturing digital economy for a digital Nigeria.

He assured that the Nigerian Government through his ministry and in collaboration with relevant stakeholders would support this initiative to ensure it is implemented in all the States in Nigeria. He said the implementation would immensely contribute to massive job creation, improvement in the income of farmers and country's GDP.

Dr Pantami, however, called on private sector,

development partners and state governments to support this initiative; partner with the Nigerian Government in the areas of finance, farm inputs, research and development, capacity building, smart solutions & services, green energy among others.

The success of this initiative in the agriculture sector, he said, would practically demonstrate the potentials inherent in digital technologies and innovations as the great enabler of the digital economy.

The Director General of NITDA, Kashifu Abdullahi, in his remarks said: “We believe leveraging digital technologies and innovations will attract youthful population into agriculture and create new digital business models across the agriculture value chain.

“It will enable millions of jobs, increase productivity and contribution of the agriculture to GDP thereby making Nigeria a leading nation in food security and exporter of standard agricultural produce to the rest of the world”.

He recalled that the programme was first piloted in Jigawa state earlier this year adding that the project was initiated to systematically adopt farmers across the 774 local government areas, LGAs in the country.

This, he said, was in order to equip them with necessary digital skills that would make Nigeria one of the leading nations for smart agriculture.
