Nigeria recognises that young teachers are the future of digital education and are doing everything possible to enable them bring their knowledge and competencies and is willing to work closely with Nigerian teachers to enhance their digital skills.

Kole Jagun, president/chairman of Council, Computer Professionals (Registration council) of Nigeria (CPN) noted that the advent and persistence of the pandemic changed the face of education across Nigeria, and globally, over 1.2 million students are now out of class rooms. "The education system is susceptible to external dangers," he said.

"Nigeria needs notable addition of e-learning in order not to lag behind, solutions and outcomes from the workshop will help review qualitative impact across the nation."

He concluded that the Computer Professional Regulation body in Nigeria will continue to work with NCS through the process.

Edidiong Lawrence Moses, head of Administration Technology, representing the Secretary General, Prof Yakubu said NCS has been critical in education enhancement in Nigeria and it is improving education quality in the country. "The organisation is proud to identify with you in all your endeavors."

Prof Paulinus Okwelle reiterated that e-learning focus of this kind resonates with the current developments brought about by the pandemic.

"There is a compulsory computer course for all NCE students who must be proficient in IT and more programmes to enhance teachers' digital skills should be put in place", Okwelle said. "Mandate is observatory of quality educational practice across the world.

OKEBUKOLA: DIGITAL SKILLS, LOCAL CONTENT DEVELOPMENT KEY TO ECONOMIC GROWTH

he former Executive Secretary, National University Commission (NUC), Prof. Peter Okebukola has stressed the need digital skills development for professionals among of Computer Science and the need for the adoption of local content learning tools in any environment.

Citing the 2020 report on the state of university in Nigeria, Okebukola said the report further urged professors of Computer Science to regularly upscale their digital skills.

Okebukola advice the gave while recently, presenting а keynote paper webinar at а organised by Nigeria the Computer Society (NCS).

According to Okebukola, teachers in the universities would need to improve on their digital literacy skills.

"There is therefore urgent need to revise the university curriculum

and re-focus it on digital literacy. I that the Teachers' happy am Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN) is organising training for university programmes teachers to enhance their digital literacy skills. NUC has come up with a new curriculum and digital literacy is the major component of the new curriculum.

This is important because the acquisition of digital literacy skills important to is very everv student, irrespective of their disciplines."

Speaking about the importance of the new curriculum for schools, Okebukola said the digital literacy aspect of the new curriculum, made it a good trigger for the acquisition of relevant educational skills in schools. He equally stressed the need for refresher courses for teachers at all levels of education, including university education, adding that the professors at the universities

need to update their digital skills.

Okebukola also stressed the need for local content development across all learning centres, adding that the use of local contents in teaching and learning, will make the students learn faster with high level of retention on what have been thought. "I hate to see images and learning tools that are alien being displayed on power point presentations, because such will not impart good knowledge on the students. Teachers should be innovative enough in today's digital era to use indigenous contents for their teaching aids and tools," Okebukola said.

COMMUNIQUÉ ISSUED AT THE E-LEARNING/IT EDUCATION FORUM HELD VIRTUALLY, ON WEDNESDAY, 19TH JANUARY, 2022.

1.0 Preamble

Nigeria Computer Society (NCS), the umbrella body for all IT practitioners and interest groups, has a core mandate of promoting and developing computing education in Nigeria. NCS has renewed its commitment to this goal by introducing many strategies and programmes for improving the standard of education in Nigeria.

E-learning / Information Technology Education was conceived to accelerate the adoption of technology-based learning in our various schools and institutions. The theme of the Forum is Advancing Technology-Based Learning in Nigeria: Prospects, Challenges, and Strategies.

The paradigm shift in teaching and learning using technology resulting majorly from the advent of Covid-19 has compelled many educational institutions at all levels to switch forcefully to e-learning and all types of technology-based learning for effective teaching and learning delivery. NCS assembled stakeholders from academia, industry, and government to discuss and strategize for improved adoption of e-learning at all levels of the educational system in Nigeria. The forum also reviewed and assessed computing education in Nigeria for effective and qualitative impact in the nation. Participants were also exposed to the innovative ways of enhancing e-learning and computing education in Nigeria.

2.0 Attendance

The Forum was well attended with over three hundred participants in attendance. The Forum was declared opened by the Chief Host, the President of NCS, Professor Adesina Sodiya, FNCS. In attendance were; the Honourable Minister of Education, ably represented by his technical assistant, Mal. Mohammed Mahmud, Mr. Kole Jagun FNCS, (President and Chairman in Council, Computer Professionals Registration Council of Nigeria), Captains of the industry, and Elders of the Profession.

Guest speakers at the forum were; Prof. Peter Okebukola FNCS, Chairman, Governing Council, National Open University of Nigeria; Professor Don Passey, Chairman, IFIP TC3, ICT and Education; Chief Tim Akano FNCS, MD/CEO New Horizon; Dr. Abubakar Isah FNCS, Director of ICT, Federal Ministry of Education; and Dr. Michael O. Edeh, HOD, Mathematics and Computer Science, Coal City University, Enugu.

Representatives from academia, government, policymakers, and corporate organisations in attendance includes; National Board of Technical Education (NBTE), The Executive

Resolutions 3.0

The forum examined the present and future (next five years) of e-learning infrastructure and tools, students' readiness, teachers' readiness, and deployment of elearning. Based on the facts presented and discussed, the forum, therefore, affirms that:

- i.) Government should encourage international OEMs to build production plants in Nigeria to reduce the cost of digital devices.
- ii.) The telecom industries should support technology-based learning by creating separate educational data rates.
- iii.) Government should improve the supply of electricity across the nation for improved adoption of technology-based learning.
- iv.) Federal ministry of education, Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN), and National Teachers' Institute (NTI) should work with Nigeria Computer Society (NCS) to develop and implement modern digital literacy and capacity building programmes for teachers and students.
- v.) Federal ministry of education should work in conjunction with NCS and CPN to revise school curricula with emphasis on digital literacy.
- vi.) Heads and chief executives of schools and tertiary institutions should pay attention to the maintenance of infrastructure that supports/enable technology-based learning.
- vii.) Federal Ministry of education should work with NCS and NITDA in developing indigenous content for e-learning.
- viii.) TETFUND, corporate organisations, and other stakeholders should encourage technology-based education by providing adequate funding.

- ix.) Government should develop technology-based education techniques for the nomadic to reduce the security challenges the country is currently facing.
- x.) Corporate organisations providing e-learning services should work with NCS and CPN to further promote their products and services.
- xi.) There should be enhanced collaboration between government agencies and NCS for efficient delivery of e-learning in Nigeria.
- xii.) Government should develop sustainable strategies for enhancing students' participation in technology-based learning especially in the rural areas
- xiii.) There is a need for massive investment in computer education and e-learning in Nigeria. Government and corporate organisations should brace up and give adequate attention to this.
- xiv.) Government should increase the budget for education in Nigeria for technologybased learning to be properly developed in Nigeria.
- xv.) Private sectors should heavily support the provision and deployment of e-learning in our various institutions, as government cannot do it alone.
- xvi.) Lecturers of tertiary institutions and teachers should be provided with regular technological training and technical support needed for efficient e-learning delivery.
- xvii.) All teachers of Computer Education in primary and secondary school, and all lecturers of computing in tertiary institutions must register with NCS and CPN to promote professionalism.
- xviii.) Rapid national growth can be achieved through computing/Information Technology education and government at all levels must be committed to its development


