With increasing threats and invasion of Nigeria's cyberspace even across MDAs and organised private sector, the President, Nigeria Computer Society (NCS), Prof. Adesina Sodiya, has



averred that the Society's current momentum of conferences, sensitization outreach and workshop across the country is geared at enhancing the country's cybersecurity.

While further underscoring the reasons for its frequent stakeholder's workshop and sensitization programmes across the country, he added that such engagement and knowledge sharing of stakeholders' expertise in the Information Communication Technology (ICT) ecosystem is a strategy that will enhance the

safety and security of Nigeria's cyber space.

The President who spoke at the side line of the Stakeholder's Forum 2.0, organised by Society, at the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN), Abuja, expressed optimism that the recommendations from its deliberations will assist government at all levels, individuals and the organised private in enhancing the nation's cybersecurity.

He said: "With the Office of the National Security Adviser (ONSA), the National Identity Management Commission (NIMC), University Lecturers, Bankers and other agencies that are represented today you can be sure that what we are going to come up with recommendations that will assist government in taking proactive decisions on how to enhance our nation's cybersecurity.

According to Sodiya, the current

wave of cybercrime informed NCS's National Executive Council (NEC) to engage MDAs and the private sector on cyber security and the deployment of counter measure for secured cyber space.

He said: "When we came onboard IN 2019, we discovered that we have not been doing much in cyber security, therefore we moved quickly to articulate our plans which is the result of the cybersecurity 2.0 that you are witnessing today, adding that the essence of the programme is to develop strategise on how to improve Nigeria's cybersecurity.

The President, who said NCS has over 20,000 active members across the country, added: "We are all aware that cyber threat is on the increase not only in Nigeria but globally and other countries of the world. And because of the digital infrastructure that we have, anybody that is going to

perpetrate cybercrime does not need to be in Nigeria, that person can be in China or India and attack a company in Nigeria.

“And of course, the situation is not abating, it is on the increase and that is why NCS has decided to take a lead in championing the development of robust cybersecurity in Nigeria.”

While another related programme is being planned for the first of August in Abeokuta, he stressed the programmes is put together for organisations, individuals, experts from different sectors of the economy to come together to discuss how to improve cybersecurity in Nigeria.

On partnership with the National Open University, he explained that NOUN has become a long-time partner of NCS, adding: “This event will be the sixth that is being held in NOUN, Abuja. The NCS also has a programme that is called

Research and Development (R/D) workshop.

He expressed appreciation to the Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. Femi Peters, for his willingness and approval of the use of the University facility to run NCS’s various programmes.

Sodiya, explained that this can also be attributed to the fact that the current VC is passionate about Information Technology (IT) development and of course you will also notice that NOU is driving their processes and operations using IT and so it was not difficult for him to give his approval of the University as the venue for our programmes.

NIGERIA COMPUTER SOCIETY SEEKS STRATEGIES TO PROTECT NIGERIA'S CYBERSPACE

The Nigeria Computer Society (NCS), has appealed to the Federal Government to develop a national cybersecurity strategy and regulatory framework to protect the country's cyberspace.

The President of NCS, Prof. Adeshina Sodiya, said this during the three-day cyber security forum and workshop in Abuja.

He said the initiatives must be

multi-stakeholders approach, including paying close attention to the construction of incident response capacities in all sectors.

daily. "As a nation, we are not as developed in the area of cyber security like other developed countries where they meet twice a month to strategise and also update.

"Any nation that is not talking or coming up with strategies on how to protect or manage the digital infrastructure is not safe.

"Many organisations and individuals not only in Nigeria are moving their activities online, people want to be sure they are safe to transact and conduct their activities

where they are not monitored," Sodiya said.

He, however, said many Nigerians

had been victims of cybercrimes, adding that cybercrimes would be on the increase when digital economy was fully implemented in the country.

Sodiya said there were three levels of cyber-attacks, "confidentiality, integrity and availability".

He, however, said cybercrime



could be committed in any part of the world not necessarily in Nigeria, adding that there was need to protect the digital infrastructure.

Sodiya said the aim of the forum was to address the current situation and proffer possible solutions on cyber security to be on the same page with other developed countries.

The Chairman, African Union Cyber security Expert Group, Mr Abdulhakeem Ajijola, said there was need for more capacity building in cyber security and improvement in the area of awareness as the common man was becoming digitalised.

“We need to improve in governance mechanism and make sure we adhere to the right kind of standards.

“We need to make sure the policies already articulated are more thoroughly implemented in the various sectors.

“Governments cannot act alone,

and the participation of the technical community and the private sector as well as the civil societies are essential to building effective resilience capabilities,” he said.

Mr Kola Okunola, the Director, Intelligence Strategic Data Mining and Analysis Development of Federal Inland Revenue Service (FIRS), said youths should leverage on the positive opportunities in the cyberspace.

He said the youths could improve in their field of studies as well as engage in courses and free trainings online.

Okunola commended NCS on their efforts to come up with the forum, saying there was need to have an enabling environment for the younger generation to thrive

NCS URGES ALL MDAS TO ESTABLISH AN IT DEPARTMENT

The Nigeria Computer Society (NCS), the umbrella organization for all information technology (IT) professionals in Nigeria, has urged for the creation of IT departments in federal, state, and local government Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs).

During a conversation with news journalists in Lagos, Professor Adesina Sodiya, President of NCS, emphasized the importance of the government creating an IT department in all MDAs.

In today's digital world, where knowledge-based capabilities in IT are driving development, he said the creation of an IT Department will assist government drive IT development much more quickly.

"Towards the close of 2019, the federal government, through the Head of Service, announced a policy requiring all MDAs to begin the process of digitizing their operations and processes," according to NCS President.

"NCS is interested in seeing that all government operations are automated, with digitalisation being

the initial step in that process." There is no way to automate physical files and operations without first digitizing them. "As an advocacy organization, NCS will continue to seek collaboration with the government on digital skills and the digitalisation of government services and processes," Sodiya stated.

He did say, however, that in order to accomplish automation in government circles, all MDAs should establish a Department of Information Technology to advance digitisation of government services and processes.

"Today, not all government MDAs have an IT Department. Most federal ministries lack an IT department, which is abnormal because governments cannot talk about automating MDA services to drive digital transformation in government without first establishing IT departments. It will be difficult for the administration to meet its mandate on digital transformation in the civil service if we do not have a distinct Department of IT," Sodiya remarked.

NITDA REINFORCES ALLIANCE WITH NIWIIT TO CLOSE DIGITAL GENDER DIVIDE

The DG who was represented by the Deputy Director, Digital Economy Department, Dr. Amina Sambo threw open the challenge at the 10th Year Anniversary of the Nigeria Women in Information Technology, (NIWIIT) National Conference in Lagos.

Inuwa, in his goodwill message on the theme “Unleashing Innovation: Scaling Up Digital Skills for Women and Girls” noted that bringing women to speed in the Nation’s digital economy journey is critical to the country’s long-term prosperity.

“Women and girls account for more than 50% of our population. At this age, building the digital skills of this population is one of the most strategic and wisest things any Government could embark on to unleash innovation in entrepreneurship and other frontiers for social and economic growth”.

The NITDA DG while commending the organizers for bringing the digital gender divide concerns to the front burner at its 7th National

Conference, was optimistic that the panel discussion sessions will give great insights into creative approaches toward building the digital skills of the women in the most impactful manner. He averred that that the ongoing efforts will not only help the country to prepare girls and women for future opportunities but also for global competitiveness.

Inuwa who made reference to the African Developer Ecosystem report, quoted that “Female career growth was heavily impacted as childcare and home responsibilities increased during COVID-19 lockdown.”

The Director-General observed that women and girls are faced with fewer opportunities to develop and explore the heights of their potential, which are mostly attributed to limited support and placements for them, physiological reasons, and perceived relegation of women folk to home keeping and childbearing; thereby truncating the potentials women carry, long before they can be developed.

“These realities remain more dominant in the developing countries of the world. While women in first-world countries also deal with problems of career resilience, their counterparts in poorer countries have the other hurdles of poverty, poor healthcare, and low standard of living, to deal with on a daily basis, thereby depriving them of a conducive environment to develop their potential”.

The NITDA Boss however expressed confidence in the possibility of changing the narrative with the growth in digital technology penetration and consumption in Nigeria; stressing that to fully harness the opportunities that abound, however requires reorientation, contemporary training in digital literacy and skills, and training that will equip women and girls with the digital skills they need to participate in the ever-growing global digital

economy which Oxford Economics values at \$11.5 trillion dollars or approximately 16% of the Global Economy.

Digital solutions and the requisite digital skills have the potential to create opportunities for women to make a difference in society and earn industry-standard fees for making such services available, further positioning themselves to export their skills internationally as real drivers of change”.

Having understood the potential of the value women can create, the National Information Technology Development Agency (NITDA), Inuwa said has been making significant strides to empower women in developing digital skills through the creation of various capacity building programmes and initiatives to support digital entrepreneurship in women and also accelerate the achievement of the objectives of its digital literacy

and skills strategy. “We give women and girls special consideration in all of our initiatives and programmes. Women should not be discouraged; there are favourable reports about girls and women’s development. Therefore, there is a need to continue creating and strengthening awareness and preparing our women and girls for the challenge of today and preparing them for tomorrow’s opportunities”, the DG stressed.

Inuwa who maintained that the rapid rise of digital consumption in Nigeria has created a gap in the supply chain that highly skilled and trained women and girls in IT can fill, charged NIWIIT to create awareness of the need to continually build the digital skills needed to harness opportunities and create value that never existed before through innovations.

He assured the group that the Agency is happy to be associated with the platform and will do its best to support the implementation of the conference’s recommendations in order to unleash a digital

entrepreneurship innovations for everyone’s social and economic development.

Dele Bayo-Osibo, the President of the Nigerian Women in Information Technology (NIWIIT), while asserting that inclusion is the currency of the moment, in general and digital inclusion in particular, affirmed that the urgency to be included in the moving train cannot be overemphasized and must be intentional.

“NIWIIT must take on the baton and contribute her quota to this clarion opportunity for building the Nation of the future”, she added.

The NIWIIT President expressed appreciation to NITDA and other collaborators for identifying with the platform and its projections.

Other speakers also added their voices to the dire need of closing the digital gender gap for the collective prosperity of all, irrespective of gender, tribe, or political affiliations.

- Authors are to submit full papers in English on original work intended for presentation at the conference. Only full papers submitted through [easychair](https://easychair.org/cfp/S3N2022) will be considered. Please use the link <https://easychair.org/cfp/S3N2022> to submit your paper.
- Paper submission must include full details of authors (names, addresses, and e-mails) and their affiliations.
- All Papers should not be more than 4,000 words, single-spaced in Times New Roman with 12 point font size using the American Psychological Association (APA) referencing style 7th Edition
- Where there are multiple authors, at least one author must pre-register to qualify for inclusion of the paper in conference proceedings.
- Selected papers may be considered for publication in International Journals, including the Journal of Computer Science and Its Applications; and the International Journal of Information Security, Privacy and Digital forensics published biannually by Nigeria Computer Society.
- All approved papers for presentation will be in NCS supported PowerPoint (.ppt) presentation format which will be communicated to Authors of approved papers.
- All submitted papers will be peer-reviewed by qualified reviewers. The authors are requested to submit their original and unpublished work in full not later than March 31, 2022
- Authors are advised to employ the IMRaD (Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion) format for their papers.
- Authors are also advised to check the plagiarism status of their papers before submission. Note that the maximum acceptable similarity index for the papers in this Conference is 15%.

All submitted papers must be previously unpublished and may not be considered for review or publication somewhere else during the period at which such articles are undergoing NCS review.

Selected papers will be published in *FIP Advances in Information and Communication Technology*, indexed by SCOPUS, WoS, Google Scholar, SCImago, among others, and will be available in the SpringerLink Digital Library.

PROFESSIONAL FELLOWSHIP UPGRADE APPLICATION

REQUIREMENTS

The Nigeria Computer Society Fellowship award is granted to interested members with proven and verifiable track records; and known to be an authority in the field of computing with significant contributions to the growth of the profession over the years.

Requirements – (A):

1. Be at least thirty years of age and has not less than ten years relevant professional working experience, at least five of which must have been in position of senior management responsibility.
2. Has professional activities and achievements justified and accepted as an authority in the profession.
3. Be considered by the Society to be fit and proper person to be so recognized.
4. Holds a certificate of an examination or examinations recognized by the society for the membership grade.
5. Has his/her application sponsored by two fellows, who are financially up-to-date with NCS, College of Fellows and CPN.

6. Applicant for Fellowship grade must have been a Member for at least 10 (ten) years, of which at least 2 (two) years out of 3(three) years (preceding the date of application), of regular attendance/participation in the activities of the Society can be verified.
7. Must have been registered by CPN for at least 3 years

Requirements – (B):

1. First degree (HND or B.Sc.) in Computer Science/ Information Technology/any related discipline OR Computer Professional Examination (CPE Stage II)
2. Practicing IT for a minimum of 20 years
3. Must have registered with NCS and CPN or concurrently registering with the Fellowship application.
4. Must pay special admission fee to be determined by the Council.
5. Must also fulfil (2), (3), (4), (5) in Requirements – (A) above
